

Two Palatial Capitol Hill Residences Ready for Occupancy





A home that when completed will cost fully \$100,000, including the grounds, is being rapidly completed at the southeast corner of East Prospect and Fourteenth Avenue North for George H. Parker of the United Wireless Telegraph Company. This building follows more closely than any other residence in the city the pure Colonial style. The grounds are being beautifully graded. The architect who drew the plans and superintended the construction is F. A. Sexton.

A home that when completed will cost \$20,000 for the house alone is being erected at the southwest corner of Fifteenth Avenue North and Ward Street for Frank E. Burns, vice-president and general manager of the Alaska Steamship Company. The house is built on plans copied from the modern English half-timbered structures, and is one of the most beautiful homes of that style in the city. The architect is James M. Shack. The builders are Kieburtz, Smith & Roundtree.
