

CAPITOL HILL LOTS BRING \$18,000

George H. Parker Acquires Two Pieces of Property on Prospect Street at Corner of Fourteenth Avenue.

Residence to Be Erected Will Exceed \$15,000 in Cost— Within Half Block of Pader- ewski's Lots.

George H. Parker, fiscal agent of the United Wireless Telegraph Company, has closed a deal for the purchase of two lots at the southwest corner of Fourteenth Avenue North and East Prospect Street. The consideration was \$18,000.

Under the terms of the sale, Mr. Parker must begin the erection within sixty days of a residence to cost not less than \$15,000. The plans of Mr. Parker contemplate a larger building.

Mr. Parker has owned for some time the two inside lots adjoining the two just purchased. They are Nos. 13 and 14, in block 12, Capitol Hill Division No. 3. The lots just acquired are Nos. 11 and 12.

The sale was made by Chester F. White, representing a syndicate, and the deal was made through the office of A. Robinson & Co.

The property is within half a block of the lot purchased a few months ago by Ignace Paderewski, the pianist.
