

Miss Horton, Daughter of City Pioneer, Dies

Funeral services for Miss Caroline E. Horton, 72 years old, daughter of the late Dexter Horton, pioneer Seattle capitalist, were being arranged today by the Bonney-Watson Company.

Miss Horton, secretary-treasurer of Dexter Horton Building, Inc., died in a rest home yesterday after a long illness. Her home was at 2815 Boylston Av. N.

Miss Horton was born in the old family home at Third Avenue and Seneca Street, now the site of the Telephone Building. Her mother was Caroline E. Parsons Horton, second wife of Seattle's first banker.

Educated in Seattle Public Schools and the University of Washington, Miss Horton was a member of Phi Beta Kappa, scholastic honorary, and Delta Gamma Sorority.

After her graduation from the University of Washington, Miss Horton began working in the office of her father.

Miss Horton played a leading role in the erection of the Dexter Horton Building as a memorial to her father.

Miss Horton was a charter member of the Women's University Club. She was a member of the Pioneer Association of Washington and Plymouth Congregational Church.

Surviving are a niece, Miss Myrtle Horton Jones, Carmel, Calif., and five cousins, Miss Alice Penfield, Miss Helen Penfield, Miss Millie Horton, Miss Persis Horton and Mrs. Mabel Smith, all of Seattle.
